K12 Program

The K12 Pipeline equips elementary, middle, and high school students in Georgia with valuable construction skills. This program is a collaboration among the Georgia Department of Education, educators, counselors, work-based learning coordinators, CTAE administrators, legislators, and industry partners.

Avi Sanchez

Marion E. Barnes Career Center, Class of 2023; Laborer/Superintendent-in-Training, **RW Allen Construction**

Avisai "Avi" Sanchez had a successful launch to his career in construction due to his strong work ethic and some positive role models in his corner—his father, who is also in construction, and Monte Ward, Avi's construction teacher at Augusta's Marion E. Barnes Career Center, a program Construction Ready supports.

With the skills he learned, Avi finished second at his SkillsUSA Regional contest in January 2022 and won the AGC Skills Challenge the following August. By then, he had caught the eye of several employers including Scott Clark, president and CEO of RW Allen. Avi graduated third in his class and started work with RW Allen the Monday after graduation.

"Scott Clark was always looking after me. We grew a connection that was more than just work or more than just competing. He would call the school, asking how my grades were, making sure I was going to my classes."



Tender, Pheonix International

Two years ago, Ryan Gilbert took a Metals Pathway course at Harris County High School. Now he's repairing pipelines and bridges underwater. He's a tender for Phoenix International in his second year of a commercial diving career.

"Normally in construction, you have specialties," Ryan said. "When it comes to diving, because there are many different jobs that have to be done, the diver basically has to understand how to work with everything down there."

His biggest assignment was working on the collapsed Key Bridge in Maryland. "It was pretty nerve-wracking to get the call, but once you get there, you don't really have time to think of its importance until it is done."

Ryan enjoys his exciting career and credits the programs sponsored by Construction Ready to set him on his path.

"When you show students they can get their OSHA 10, they can get credentials that mean something in the real world."

Melany Rodriguez

Lanier College and Career Academy, Class of 2023; **Electrical Apprentice, Titan Electric**

Melany Rodriguez first learned from her father, an electrician. Once she started the Construction Ready program in high school, there was no stopping her.

"I would practice [connecting wires] through a switch to a light bulb and an outlet. Just practice and practice, do it again and again until I got it right."

Her dedication paid off. She placed first in the SkillsUSA regional and qualified for the SkillsUSA State Championships, hosted by Construction Ready. There, she connected with electrical contractors, including Titan Electric, who quickly hired her.

Melany dreams of owning an electrical business that provides employment opportunities and training for bilingual laborers.

"We used to pass by this local supermarket here in my town. I would see all these hard-working men, laborers, waiting for someone to pick them up, and I would think, 'This was my dad 18 years ago. When I get older and I'm a CEO one day, I'm going to train them and give them an opportunity just like my dad got."



Lewis Robinson

Pre-Apprenticeship Graduate, Goodwill Southern Rivers Albany; Field - Skilled Tradesman, Pellicano Construction

Lewis Robinson knew his way around a toolbox. But after starting the Construction Ready Pre-Apprenticeship training, he realized he had a lot to learn.

"Some of the terminology I was using was wrong. Some of the ways of doing things that I thought were absolutely right were absolutely wrong."

His willingness to learn and impressive work ethic helped Lewis stand out when Pellicano Construction vetted job candidates from his class.

"He's one of those impact players we can put with anybody. He rolls up his sleeves and goes to work," said Meridith Holland, Pellicano's Vice President of Corporate Development and Strategic Growth.

Lewis's goal is to become a superintendent and mentor young people in the trades. He wants more people to share his experience with his new career.

I can see something I started, I can see something I finished. Every time I pass by, I can say, 'I built that.' I love this job, period. I really do."

Kimberly Binns has the creative mind of an artist and, thanks to Construction Ready, the hands-on skills to turn a building design into reality. She earned a fine arts degree, but it wasn't until completing Construction Ready's Pre-Apprenticeship training that she found her career. After graduating in March 2024, she went to work as an office engineer for Hogan Construction Group.

"I basically hit the ground running when I got here and I continue to learn every day. It really has changed my life in a short period of time. I'm a hard worker, but I know for a fact that I would not have this opportunity if I had not gone through the program."



Pre-Apprenticeship Graduate, Perry Career Academy; Cabling Technician, NetPlanner Systems

Tra'Quann Williams wasn't sure what he would do after high school, but a door to a career was opened when he learned about Construction Ready's Pre-Apprenticeship program. Four weeks after starting the program, he had a job offer as a cabling technician from NetPlanner Systems.

"Construction Ready brings out great companies [to hire graduates], and you're getting great benefits at whatever company you choose. At the end of the class, you have options to do what you want to do."

Construction Ready Plus

Program participants can continue to earn more advanced credentials after they've completed the pre-apprenticeship program through Construction Ready Plus. This program is sponsored through The Home Depot Foundation and enables our pre-apprenticeship participants to gain additional skills and credentials that help them advance their careers and increase their overall income.

Jonesha Arnold

Pre-Apprenticeship and Construction Ready Plus Graduate, Westside Works; Dump Truck Driver, ER Snell

Jonesha Arnold has earned over a dozen industry credentials. She completed our pre-apprenticeship program, trained at Westside Works and Goodwill Industries, and further expanded her skills through Construction Ready PLUS classes.

Using the skills she's acquired, Jonesha built a garage, added a deck, and installed a wooden fence around her mother's property. Today, she works with ER Snell, a road and bridge construction company, delivering asphalt, sand, and gravel to road construction sites where no two days are alike.

Construction Ready has not only helped Jonesha launch her career, she wants to use the skills she's learned to make a difference. Jonesha plans to provide home repairs to residents in low-income neighborhoods.






