Camp T&I (Trade and Industry): Teacher Training

In 2025, Construction Ready took a bold step in workforce education by expanding our “train the trainer” model beyond high school. For the first time, we delivered professional development for elementary and middle school teachers—training more than 200 educators to strengthen their skills and enhance the way they prepare the next generation for the workforce.

Counselors Workshop: Student Engagement

High school counselors and work-based learning coordinators serve as bridges to opportunity. During CareerEXPO, we gave them practical tools to connect students with skilled-trade careers—reinforcing one of the most critical links in a student’s path to success.

Workforce Development: Employer Recruitment

During CareerEXPO, we brought industry recruiters to the table. Attendees got an exclusive preview of our digital platform, discovered ways to engage directly with teachers and students, and gained actionable strategies for supporting Work-Based Learning (WBL) programs. By equipping employers with resources, we’re helping bridge the gap between education and employment.

PRE-APPRENTICESHIP: IN-DEMAND SKILLS, RECOGNIZED CREDENTIALS, AND LASTING CAREERS

An integral part of Construction Ready’s mission is our 20-day Pre-Apprenticeship Bootcamp—a high-impact training program that equips students with essential construction skills and up to eight industry-recognized credentials, all at no cost to participants. More than just instruction, this immersive experience prepares individuals for real-world success. In FY25 alone, we held 14 classes across 9 cities: Atlanta, East Point, Newnan, Columbus, Marietta, Savannah, Augusta, Jonesboro, and Opelika, Alabama. The results speak for themselves. An impressive 97% of graduates are matched with employers upon completion, and 75% remain in the industry.

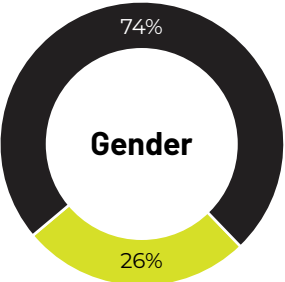

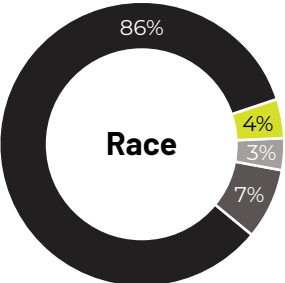

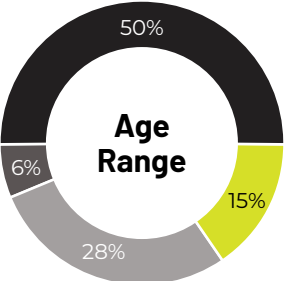

CONSTRUCTION READY PLUS: ADVANCING SKILLS, ADVANCING CAREERS

Construction Ready PLUS, in partnership with The Home Depot Foundation, is a next step for graduates who have completed the Pre-Apprenticeship program. This advanced training pathway equips participants with specialized skills and additional industry-recognized credentials—such as OSHA 30 and NCCER Crew Leadership Certification—empowering them to take on leadership roles and grow within their careers. In FY25, 55 Construction Ready students and alumni earned advanced credentials through the CR PLUS program.

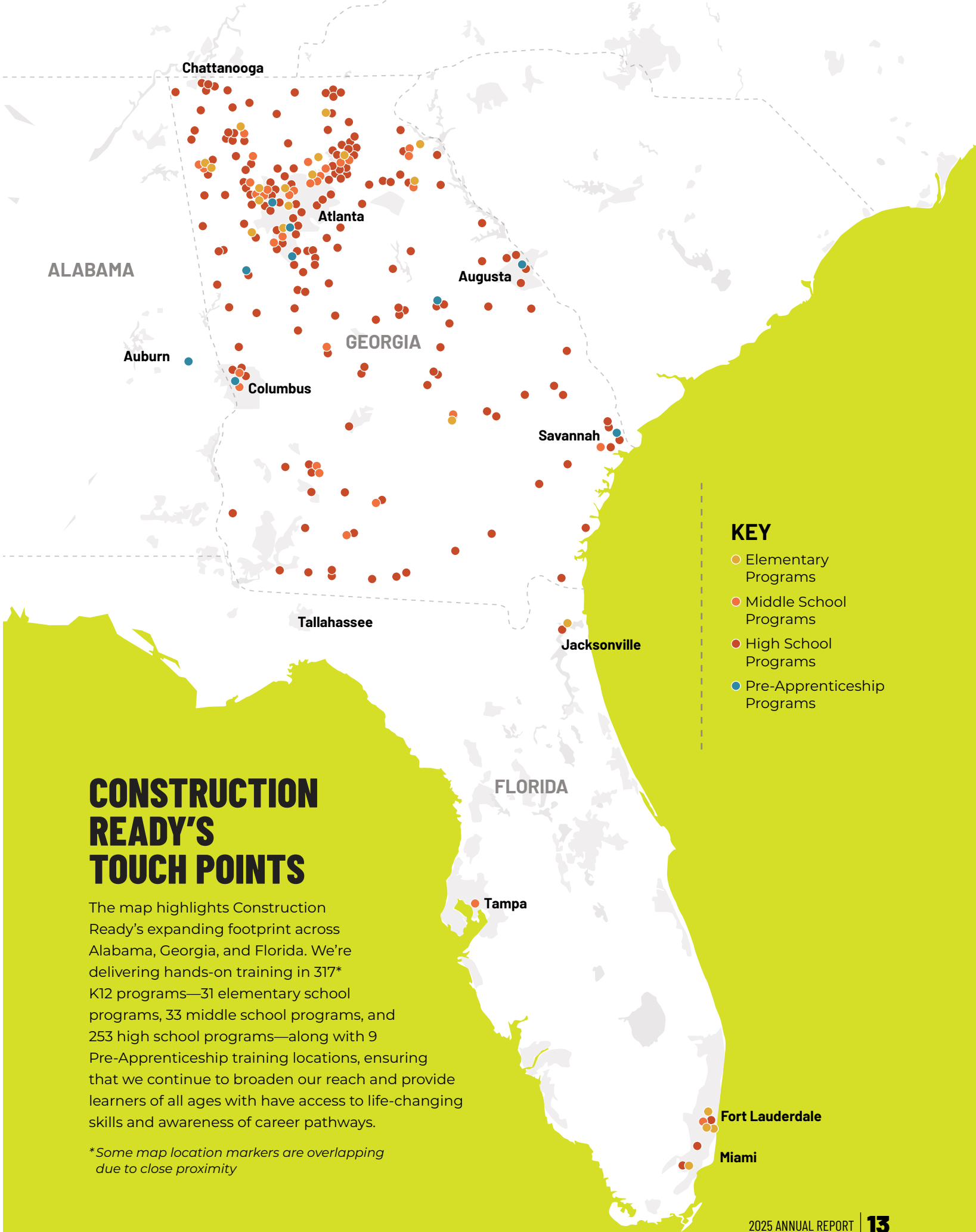

PRE-APPRENTICESHIP HIRING FAIRS

Day 19 of the Pre-Apprenticeship program is dedicated to a Hiring Fair, where students and employers connect face-to-face to explore real career opportunities. It's the culmination of hands-on training and preparation—and the moment where futures begin to take shape. Employment matches are revealed during the graduation ceremony the very next day, celebrating each student's transition from training to the workforce.

Last year, Construction Ready hosted 14 hiring fairs across Alabama, Georgia, and Florida, welcoming a record 72 employers into the process—demonstrating strong industry investment in the next generation of skilled workers.

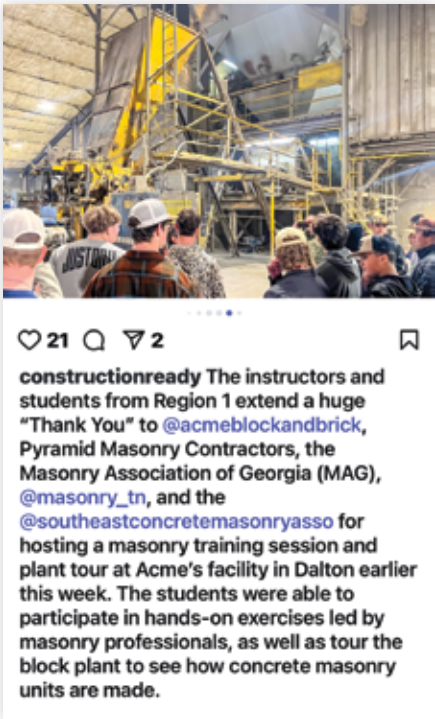
Construction Ready in the News

K12 INDUSTRY CERTIFICATION: SETTING THE STANDARD, BUILDING EXCELLENCE

In the last year, 12 high school construction programs earned Industry Certification, a mark of excellence recognizing schools that deliver workforce-ready, industry-aligned training. To earn this distinction, programs must meet 13 rigorous standards—including offering industry-recognized credentials, engaging with advisory boards, and maintaining active use of the Construction Ready Digital Platform. With these additions, there are now 80 Industry Certified schools throughout Georgia.

BUILDING THE K12 PIPELINE

Construction Ready K12 Programs inspire early, train consistently, and connect students to construction careers from elementary through high school. This year, K12 programming reached 124,373 career awareness touch points, significantly trained 8,834 high school students, and guided 2,503 high school students into a construction career pathway. In FY25 alone, the Construction Ready K12 Team created 36 new programs that helped form 9 new communities across Georgia and Florida which will create a stronger, more prepared workforce pipeline.

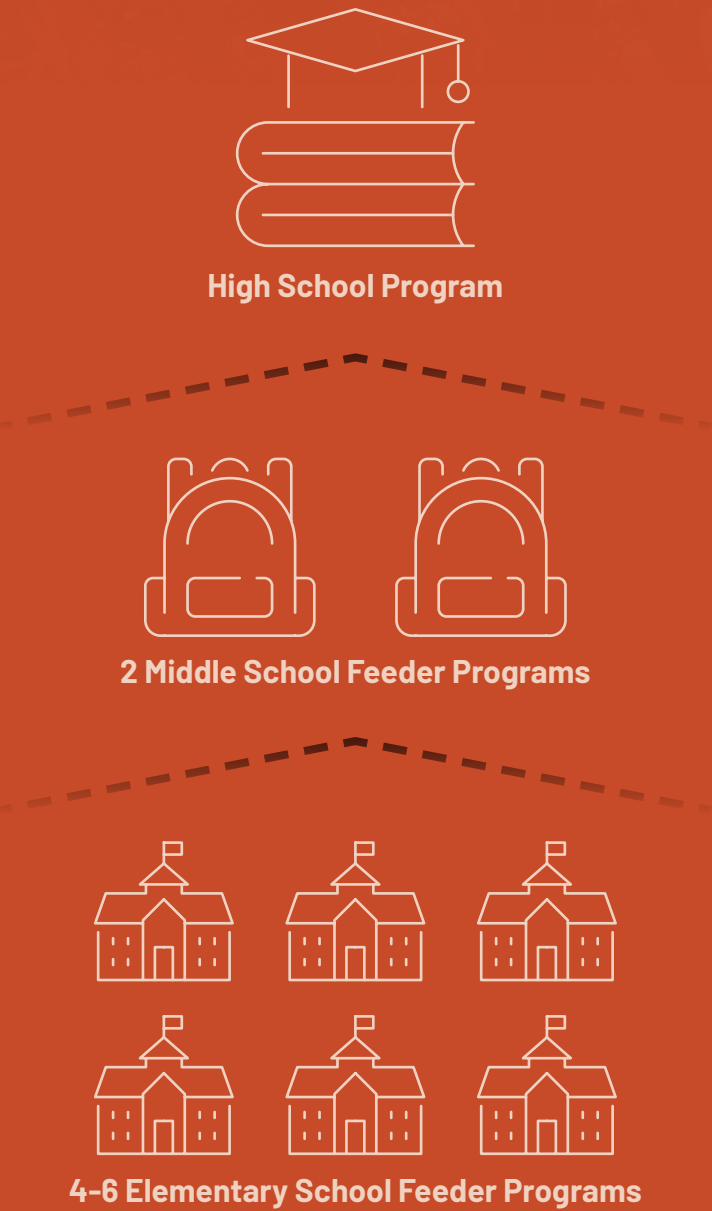

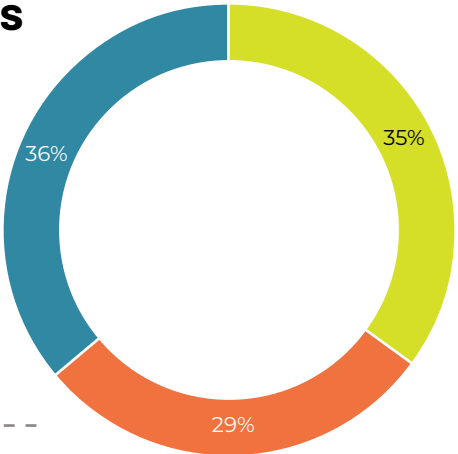

(July 2024 – June 2025)

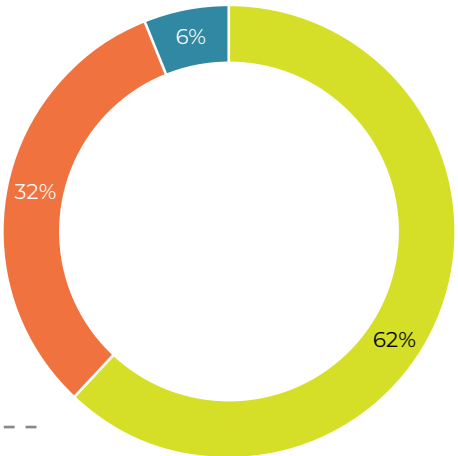
Revenue by Type

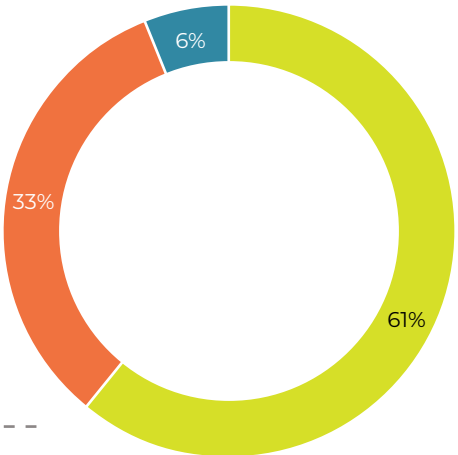
Revenue by Program

Blake Blume

Maxwell High School of Technology, Class of 2022;
Service Technician, Tebarco Mechanical

As a high school student in instructor Mike Mahaffey's HVAC class, Blake Blume found his calling. "If I didn't take that class, I wouldn't be where I am right now," Blake says. "Not only did it teach me HVAC skills, it taught me work ethic."

The program also provided valuable industry connections, one of which led Blake to a job offer from Tebarco Mechanical. After graduation, he stepped right into a career with the company. He flew through a four-year apprenticeship program in an astonishing nine months, bought his first home at age 20, got married, and has thrived as a field service technician.

"I knew I wanted to go in the trades for job security," Blake says. "The trades are always going to be around. And there's a lot of room for growth."

Collin Orme made the most of those opportunities after completing the basic curriculum in his ninth- and tenth-grade years; from that point on, he focused on special projects, particularly playhouses for local children. "I thought that was really cool," Collin says. "It was my first experience doing what I guess you could call project management." Now, as a college-level construction management student, he's headed for a career in that field.

Jacob Baughcum is a great example of how quickly a high school student can discover a promising career path through training in the skilled trades. He enrolled in Franklin County High School's Metals program as a sophomore, leading to a Work Based Learning (WBL) job as a welder with Stovall Machine Products in Lavonia. He plans to attend a technical college for more welding instruction, while continuing to build valuable work experience and rake in wages that far exceed the typical part-time jobs held by many teenagers.

As a high school senior, Brayen Jones was already well on the way to career success, having become a certified welder and fabricator, and secured a part-time job at the SteelFab plant in Dublin. Brayen initially connected with SteelFab through a rep who visited his welding class at East Laurens. He started work part-time in the summer of 2025; now that he's out of high school, he's begun a rewarding full-time career with the company.

At Marietta High, Diego Garcia enjoyed a variety of practical learning applications through instructor Michael Barcarse's Construction program. "He would always do really well when we would have our industry partners in here to go through different craft skills," Barcarse recalls. One of those industry partners was McCarthy Building Companies, which recruited Diego when he was a senior. He began work immediately after graduation and has been earning valuable experience on the massive Brookhaven City Centre project.

Jorge Moya discovered an affinity for HVAC after he enrolled in instructor Horace Kilgore's program at Lanier College & Career Academy. But first, Kilgore says, the ninth-grader "just about failed." Kilgore didn't give up, working closely with his student "to come up with a strict improvement plan"—and soon Jorge began to thrive, both in the classroom and in HVAC competitions. "Mr. Kilgore told me, 'You can do this. I know you're smart. ... Now I feel like HVAC is my thing—that's what I'm focused on.'"

Bailee Stiles entered Fannin County High School as a shy ninth-grader, but over the next four years, she transformed into a confident leader, a skilled welder, and an advocate for women in the skilled trades. "She never would take no for an answer," says FCHS instructor Terry Flowers. "If she wasn't good enough at it, then she was going to be [eventually]. She's always working, always pushing."

As a high school freshman, Brandon Carlos already had an eye on his future. "I was always interested in doing a trade," Brandon recalls. "I saw that a lot of people were retiring from HVAC, so I knew there would always be really good opportunities in the future." After graduation, Brandon went to work for Georgia Mechanical; he's also working toward an associate's degree at North Georgia Technical College, funded in part by a scholarship from the Conditioned Air Association of Georgia.

Cannon Hill learned a wide range of hands-on skills through Tift County High School's Construction Pathway, and he put those skills into action at a summer job with Tifton's Jones Construction Company for three years running. "I definitely want a construction-based career."

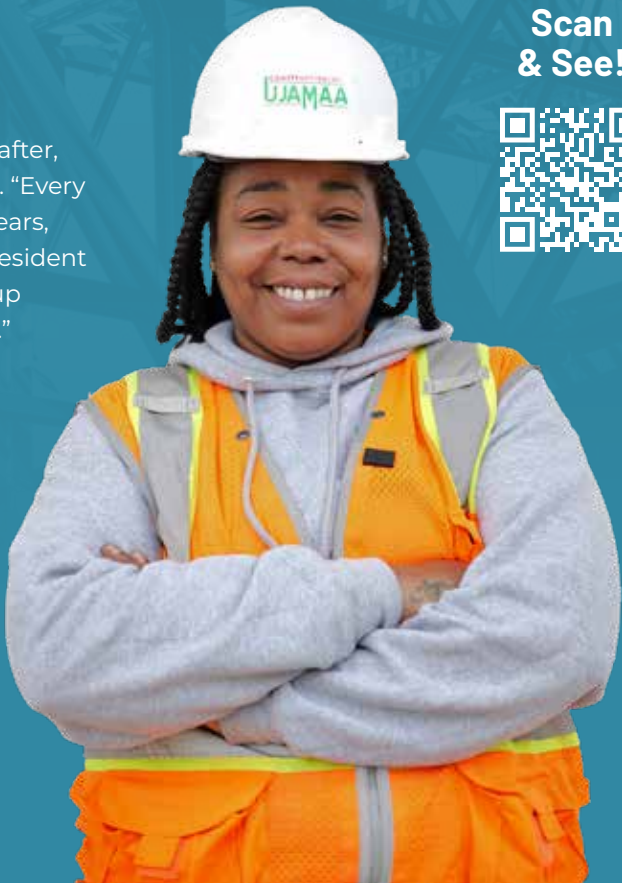
Taylor Dalrymple

Taylor Dalrymple graduated from Construction Ready's Pre-Apprenticeship program at Westside Works. Not long after, her resumé caught the attention of UJAMAA Construction. "Every one of the Construction Ready folks we've hired over the years, they want to get involved," says UJAMAA Executive Vice President Todd Pressley. "Whether it's swinging a hammer, putting up protection, doing whatever—they are invested in our work."

Seeking a career reboot, Taylor had discovered Construction Ready through a Google search. "Construction Ready ultimately helped me turn things around," she explains. "Taking that class and watching my peers get jobs was motivation for me, so I could get out in the field and make [a good living]."

Taylor certainly is doing that. She's on track for a Foreman position with UJAMAA, an industry leader in hiring and empowering women in construction. "What I would say to other women who are considering a career in construction is go for it," Taylor says. "The self-worth and the feeling of being able to say, 'I did it' is the best."

Sam Smith cycled through a variety of entry-level jobs before signing up for Construction Ready Pre-Apprenticeship training. "I told myself, 'Something always needs to be done in the construction industry, and it's probably something I can thrive in, because I like to work with my hands,'" Sam recalls. Sure enough, he was hired in November 2024 by Schnabel, an earth retention and foundation construction contractor. His training, he says, "has made a difference in my life and career, because I no longer have to worry about being laid off."

"I saw a flyer for Construction Ready, so I signed up," Tim remembers. "In the back of my head, something just clicked. It was like, 'You're about to be an adult. It's time to focus.'"

In just over a year with Georgia Cleaning Pros, Oliver Figueroa quickly worked his way through a succession of promotions, moving from Translator to Foreman to Project Manager to District Manager. "It really does help a lot to have the knowledge that Construction Ready gave us," he says. "When I came in to work, I knew what to expect and I didn't feel lost."

When Brian Hill learned about Construction Ready training, he was living at Georgia Works, a shelter focused on job training and rehabilitation, and he was at a proverbial crossroads. "It brings me joy every time I talk to him, watching him smile and seeing daddy not going in and out of jail. It's like I'm rewriting my family history."

Daynah Florence came into Pre-Apprenticeship training with some prior experience—with her fiancé, she had been co-owner of a residential and commercial framing business. She was hired by Hogan Construction as an Office Engineer and subsequently was promoted to Project Engineer. "The position I'm in right now is because of Construction Ready," Daynah says. "They literally have all the resources that people need to be successful."
